# Memorandum of Understanding

## "FORMING A PARTNERSHIP ON DISPUTE PREVENTION AND RESOLUTION"

Whereas First Nations led an initiative for the creation of national Aboriginal institutions to assist First Nations to exercise real property taxation jurisdiction on reserve lands; and

Whereas the First Nations Tax Commission (FNTC) is an Aboriginal institution established under the First Nations Fiscal and Statistical Management Act (FSMA); and

Whereas the mandate of the FNTC as set out in the FSMA includes: ensuring the integrity of the system of First Nations' real property taxation; assisting First Nations in the exercise of their jurisdiction over real property taxation; building capacity in First Nations to administer their taxation systems; promoting a transparent First Nations' real property taxation regime; and promoting understanding of the real property taxation systems of First Nations; and

Whereas the Consensus Building Institute (CBI) works to promote the fair, efficient, wise, and stable resolution of disputes through mediation, training and evaluation; and

Whereas the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (M.I.T.) and Harvard Public Disputes Program (PDP) works to replace "win-lose" outcomes with "all-gain" solutions to the highly controversial and complex problems of public policy making; and

Whereas FNTC, CBI and PDP wish to further foster and encourage an effective working relationship among the respective organizations on dispute prevention and resolution;

Therefore the FNTC, CBI and PDP agree to the following:

- 1. FNTC, CBI, and PDP are committed to ongoing dialogue on ways to support one another's mission, goals, and programs.
- 2. The parties will work together to seek among stakeholders fair and stable agreements, efficiently reached and will work together to:
  - Teach effective mutual gains negotiations skills to help prevent conflict;
  - Train others to teach effective dispute resolution skills;
  - Promote the fair and efficient resolution of disputes at the lowest possible level when conflict does arise;
  - Encourage the design and evaluation of fair and efficient dispute resolution systems; and,
  - Build capacity in First Nations and their neighbouring communities to resolve conflict.
- 3. To accomplish these goals, the parties will form an ad hoc working committee with the following intent:

- To be advisory in nature;
- To focus on dispute prevention and dispute resolution for matters related to taxation resulting from the establishment of First Nation jurisdiction;
- To develop dispute prevention and dispute resolution tools that can be applied to other disputes among First Nations and others;
- To jointly develop grant applications, training materials, and other instruments for building consensus and promoting self-determination for First Nations.
- 4. The working committee shall meet as required at mutually agreeable times and locations.
